Joana Carneiro

Noted for her vibrant performances in a wide diversity of musical styles, Joana Carneiro has attracted considerable attention as one of the most outstanding young conductors working today. In January 2009, she was named Music Director of the Berkeley Symphony, succeeding Kent Nagano and becoming only the third music director in the 40-year history of the orchestra.

Orchestrating Medicine

Her lecture, which includes a musical performance, will draw a parallel between the team work developed in Family Medicine settings and orchestra coordination. As she says "it is possible to link the team work found in Family Medicine and the achievements of an orchestra. Family Medicine covers many areas of healthcare, integrating them in one medical specialty, in the same way a musical conductor combines several instruments. In this sense, both Family Medicine and orchestra coordination develop the whole composition, even if at the same time it is important to know each of the components of that composition, in detail".

When talking about team work, Joana Carneiro will demonstrate that in her job of orchestra coordination, the biggest advantage is the possibility of creating beauty alongside other human beings, no matter who we are and where we come from, but on the other hand, the biggest challenge has to do with the fact that we are a large number of people, with different ideas, which means that we have to find a common language to convey that beauty. Similarly, family doctors embrace the same challenges and privileges, and both professions are guided by values and dreams. Joana's is to bring "happiness to people's lives through music" and inspire "those who work with her to create beauty, at the highest level" as the majority of human experiences that are relevant include music. For Family Doctors, our dream is to preserve and bring better health for all.

Margaret McCartney

Margaret McCartney is a GP in Glasgow and the author of "The Patient Paradox, why sexed up medicine is bad for your health". She has won awards for her writing, contributes regularly for the British Medical Journal and the lay press, and broadcasts for Radio 4's Inside Health. She is a keen blogger and tweeter. Her interests are in screening, evidence, risk and social inequalities.

Making patients better

"[...] sometimes, social justice can do more to prolong people's lives than the use of preventive medicines."

"There is definitely a place for good preventative medicine, but it is wrong to think that GPs doing risk factor management can replace a fair society."

"Many screening programmes show evidence of benefit... But many also have evidence of harm – not least, people sometimes avoiding doctors when they are ill to avoid being encouraged into a screening test they don't want. We have to be more mature about risk and the balance of risk; patients are autonomous and have the right to a fair discussion of risk and benefit. We have to respect that autonomy." "[...] the problem with many screening tests, for example, mammography, is the production of over diagnosis – diagnosing cancer and being treated for it even though it would never naturally have come to attention or needed treatment. If we were more honest about the pros and cons, I suspect many people would opt out – and this would prevent over diagnosis."

Michael Kidd

Michael Kidd is a family doctor and president of the World Organization of Family Doctors (WONCA). He is the executive dean of the faculty of health sciences at Flinders University and past president of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners and also chairs the Australian Government's advisory council on HIV/AIDS, viral hepatitis and sexually transmissible infections.

Innovation in GP/FM and primary care

"Medicine has always been based on the cases that we see"

We are going to talk about innovations in Family Medicine and look at the changes which are happening and having an impact on the quality and safety of the care that we provide and on the way we deliver our care, as family doctors, to our patients and our communities. One of the focuses is the role of case reports in the 21st century. Medicine has always been based on the cases that we see; we gain experience as family doctors through the patients that we encounter throughout our careers, from the very first moment we started as medical students, right to the end of our career. We are continually learning, both from the knowledge we receive and the experience that we gain through our patient care.

It is important to remember that we see things in Family Medicine which haven't been described in the medical literature before. We may see patients with new and emerging conditions, the first reports of new associations, patients with co-morbidities, which are almost always excluded from the research studies which we base a lot of our evidence from. If we are going to have evidence-based practice, we need practice-based evidence... And that evidence comes from our encounters with patients.

Family doctors are in the front line in a multitude of ways. They come across a number of situations every day and often say something like: "I don't think I've ever seen a case like this before!". A typical example involves people who start taking new medications and come in with side effects, often side effects that have never been reported. Frequently, family doctors are the ones that are able to detect the first side effects related to new medications. Now, you may see one person with it and not think very much about it, but if a thousand of your colleagues are also seeing one person with that side effect from a new medication, then it may be something that's actually really important. We have witnessed some examples of that pattern; when the first effective HIV medications were introduced, they were used widely and saved lives, but family doctors noticed some of the relevant side effects that were occurring in relation with those drugs, like lipodystrophy and lipoatrophy.

Kamran Abbasi

Kamran Abbasi is the International and Digital Editor of the British Medical Journal (BMJ). In the past, Dr. Abbasi worked as editor of the Bulletin of the World Health Organization and as chief executive and editor-in-chief of On-Medica. He was also medical director of the UK-based independent health information company Dr. Foster. Dr. Abbasi is also a keen cricket enthusiast.

Carl Edvard Rudebeck

Carl Edvard Rudebeck is a specialist in general practice and a research supervisor in Kalmar County (Sweden). He is also a professor at the Department for Community Medicine, University of Tromsø (Norway). His favorite topics of research are the intersubjectivity in the doctor–patient relationship and the importance of bodily experience.

Body and words in the consultation

“Bodily empathy – the process by which individuals communicate body experience – is crucial in medicine”

Intersubjectivity is the process by which individuals come to share experience and ideas. This sharing is never absolute; rather it is approximate, and varying by situation and context. But, still, it is the glue of relations and society and probably the most human of human capabilities. Empathy is another word, more specifically confined to experience.

In psychology, and also in medicine, empathy has primarily been associated with emotions. But in the history of hermeneutics and phenomenology, it is about experience as a whole. The weight of emotions corresponds to the weight emotions have in experience. Bodily empathy – the process by which individuals communicate body experience – is crucial in medicine, and bodily empathetic skills may be developed to a professional level by physicians. It is a pre-diagnostic skill of a certain importance to GPs who, when judging symptom presentations, often have to rely on the interaction and personal knowledge, rather than on algorithms.

The main thing is to encourage the patient to tell us about his or her problems, in a way that becomes valid to the original experience – however odd this may appear – and from there on to tell us about the feelings, thoughts and expectations. The challenge to the GP is to stay with this commitment long enough to make the patient feel that the important things were said, and that this first narrative or symptom presentation reflected the patient’s need to tell, rather than the doctor’s need to get the essential facts, as effectively as possible. With a good start, the choice of relational approach seldom becomes an issue. The platform of the relation is human existence; bodily, relational, imaginative, reflective, and vulnerable. The specific diseases define a secondary level. But on this level, once again, it appears that the disease has no existence of its own. The patient is always there in full figure, hither to the disease, from the GP’s point of view. The body has its existential anatomy, the mix of experiences and capabilities, general and specific, gross and minute, well or diseased, that set the conditions for partaking in the physical and social world. In psychiatric symptoms, consciousness is its own suffering. The person and the disease are, in either case, constructions of language.

Richard Roberts

Richard Roberts is a Professor and past head of the Department of Family Medicine at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine & Public Health. A family physician and attorney, he has been since 1987 in a teaching practice in Belleville, a rural community. Professor Roberts is past President of the World Organization of Family Doctors (WONCA) and the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Teaching and learning with a new generation of family doctors

I plan, in fact, to share with the participants at the Lisbon Conference the amazing stories of family doctors from around the world that I've been fortunate to meet and the most important things that I've learned from them.

What I'm going to share is based on my personal experiences as WONCA President, but I have also spent 30 years as a researcher, a writer, a teacher, improving the quality of care and the quality of health services provided to the population. So that, of course, will also be reflected in the presentation.

I believe there are some differences, in how people look at their work planning and in the way they find a balance between personal/family life and professional responsibilities. I also find clear differences between generations, when it comes to the use and comfort with technology. These are interesting subjects and I hope to address them in Lisbon. The technology changed some things, especially amongst the young doctors, and one of those things is the notion of possible and impossible. Nowadays, it is much easier for a medical student in Lisbon to communicate and feel closer to, for example, a young family doctor in South Island, New Zealand, because the internet brings them together.

Older and more experienced family physicians may not have had that opportunity, or ability. Obviously, some of them were involved in a global level through scientific and professional organizations and were able to meet colleagues from around the world, as they participated in international congresses and meetings, but not everybody is able to do that. With the most recent information and communication technologies everything is much easier, so I think there are some things that the younger family doctors can teach the rest of us. This new setting carries with it good things and bad things. The good part is that young family doctors may develop a better sense of global community, with people sharing interests and concerns. But sometimes, it's also a bad thing, because it may create what we, in the USA, call groupthink. This means that if everybody focuses on the same information sources and if everybody shares the same realities, in some ways there is a risk of reducing the unique cultural and local perspectives on things. In short, I'm convinced that both generations (older doctors and young family doctors) have something valuable to teach each other.

Our mission is a global one and entails the foundation of a forum for collaboration to improve GP/FM. Through our activities we aim at empowering the future generations of GPs/FPs to lead the development of primary health care at a regional, national and international level.

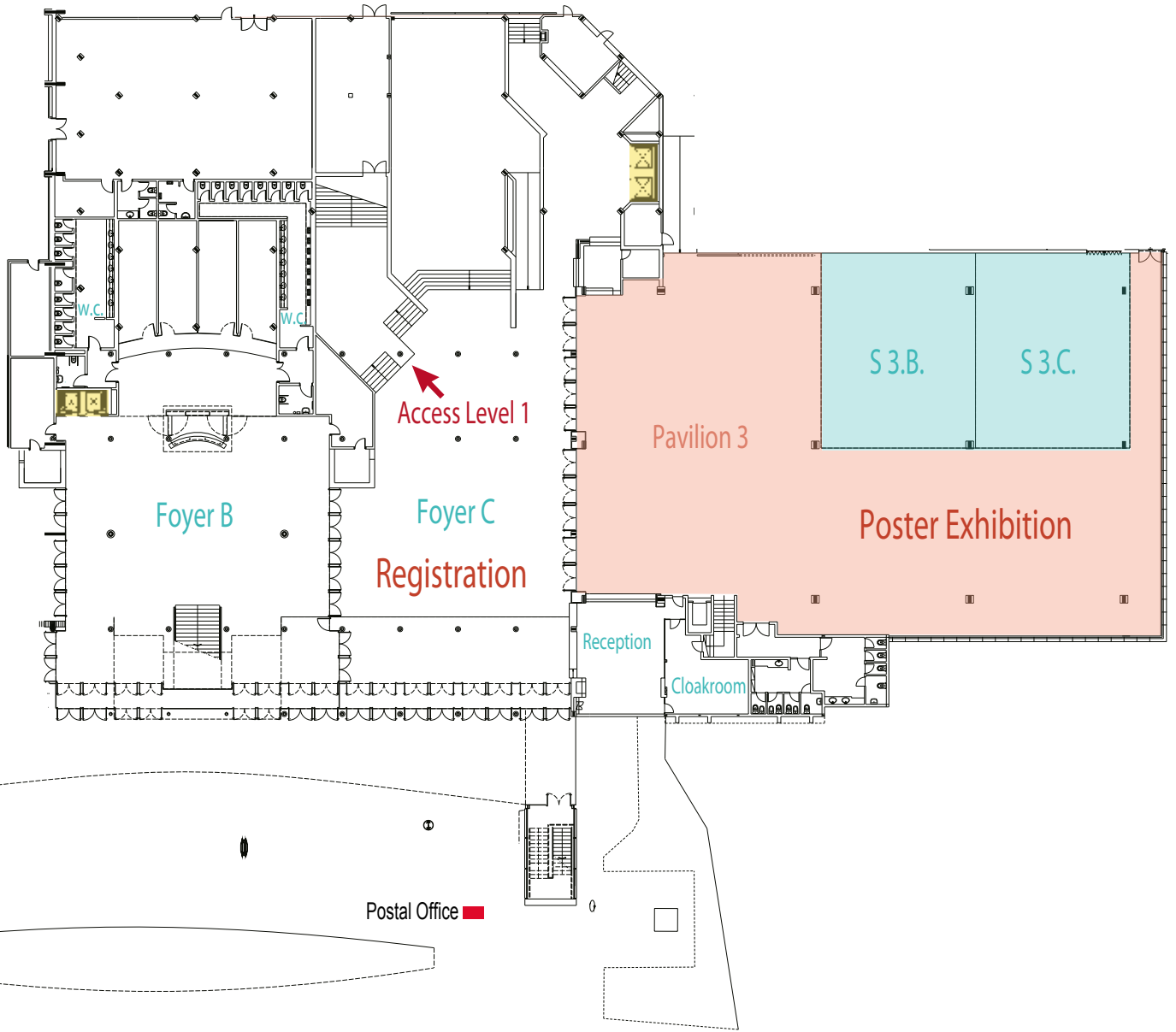

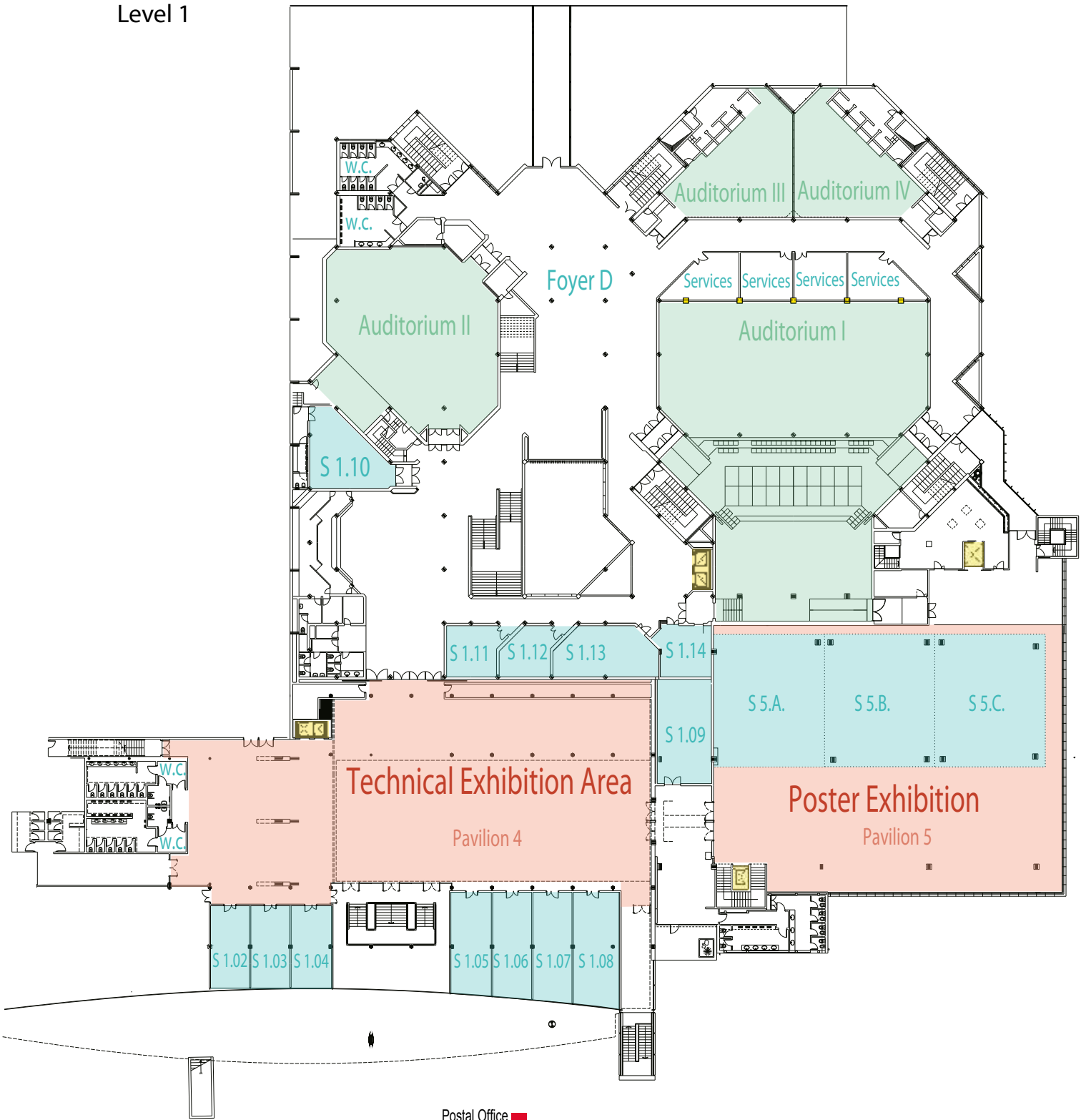

Useful information

Official Language

The official language is Portuguese.

Currency

Portugal is a member of the European Monetary System, and the previous currency Escudo was replaced by the Euro, on January 2002.

Exchange

Major credit cards are accepted in most hotels, shops and restaurants. Travellers Cheques and currency can be changed at exchange bureaux or at hotel receptions. Automatic changing and cash dispensing machines, linked to international networks, are also widely available.

Sales Tax

Sales tax (VAT) is included in prices quoted. For non EU residents, tax free shopping schemes are available in many shops, which give substantial savings to visitors.

Climate

The average maximum daily temperature and average minimum temperature in the Lisbon area, in July, are 27°C / 84 F (high) and 18°C / 64 F (low). Please take in consideration that Lisbon is located by the river and the ocean, and therefore can be windy in the late afternoon or evening. A sweater or a ladies scarf might come in handy.

Time Zone

The time zone in Portugal is GMT+00 (Lisbon, Dublin, London).

Electric Current

Portuguese standard is the European type, 2 pin sockets with 220 volts AC at 50 cycles. The phase 380 volt current is normally available in meeting rooms and exhibition halls.

Accessibility

Lisbon International Airport (Portela) is located close to the city centre (7 km), about 15-20 minutes transfer to most of the centrally located hotels. The Airport is served by daily direct flights operated by the traditional airlines, as well as by many of the low cost companies operating in Europe.

The Lisbon Underground (Metro) has a station inside the airport. There is also an Airport shuttle bus (AeroBus) with several stops in the city centre, every 30 minutes (last stop: Cais do Sodré).

Public Transportation

The joint fleet of the two public transportation companies Carris (buses and trams) and Metro (underground) covers the entire city with regular bus and tram routes as well as underground lines.

Taxis

The city is served by 3.500 taxis and a taxi ride from the airport to the city centre should cost between 8.00€ and 15.00€. The usual urban taxi fares are:
Day (06.00h to 21.00h) - 3.25€ + 0.10 €/km
Night, weekend and holidays: 3.90€ + 0.10 €/km

Taxis are widely used by the locals, and in comparison to the taxi fares in other countries, the Lisbon taxis are still to be considered a rather inexpensive means of transportation.

Health Requirements

With the exception of vaccination certificates for persons coming from areas where yellow fever is endemic, at the present there are no special health requirements.

Medical Care

Clinics and hospitals provide 24 hours emergency services. The national emergency phone number is 112. Hotels have a doctor on call through the reception. Reciprocal E.C. cover is available at out-patient departments, otherwise private consultation fees are charged.

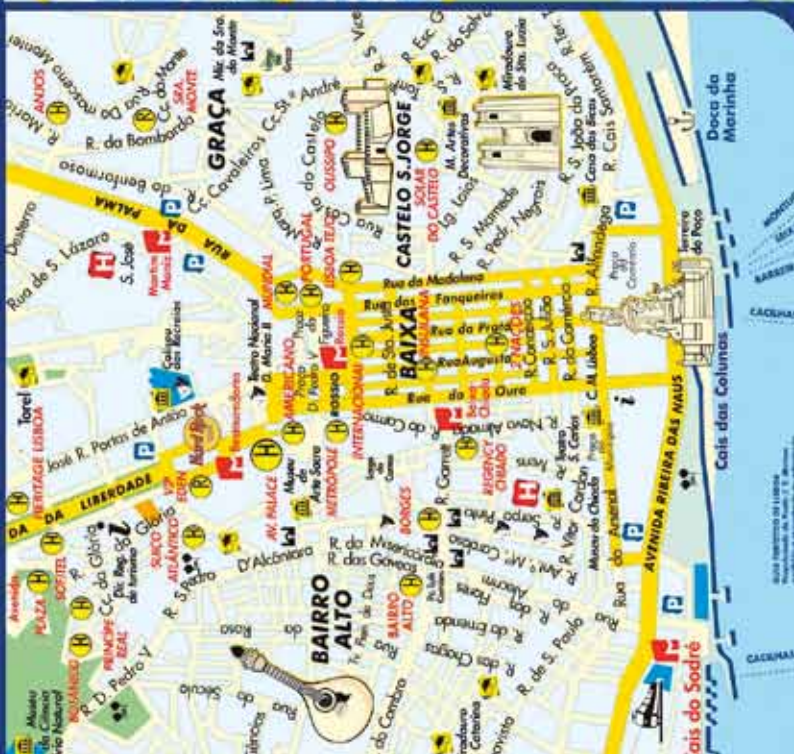
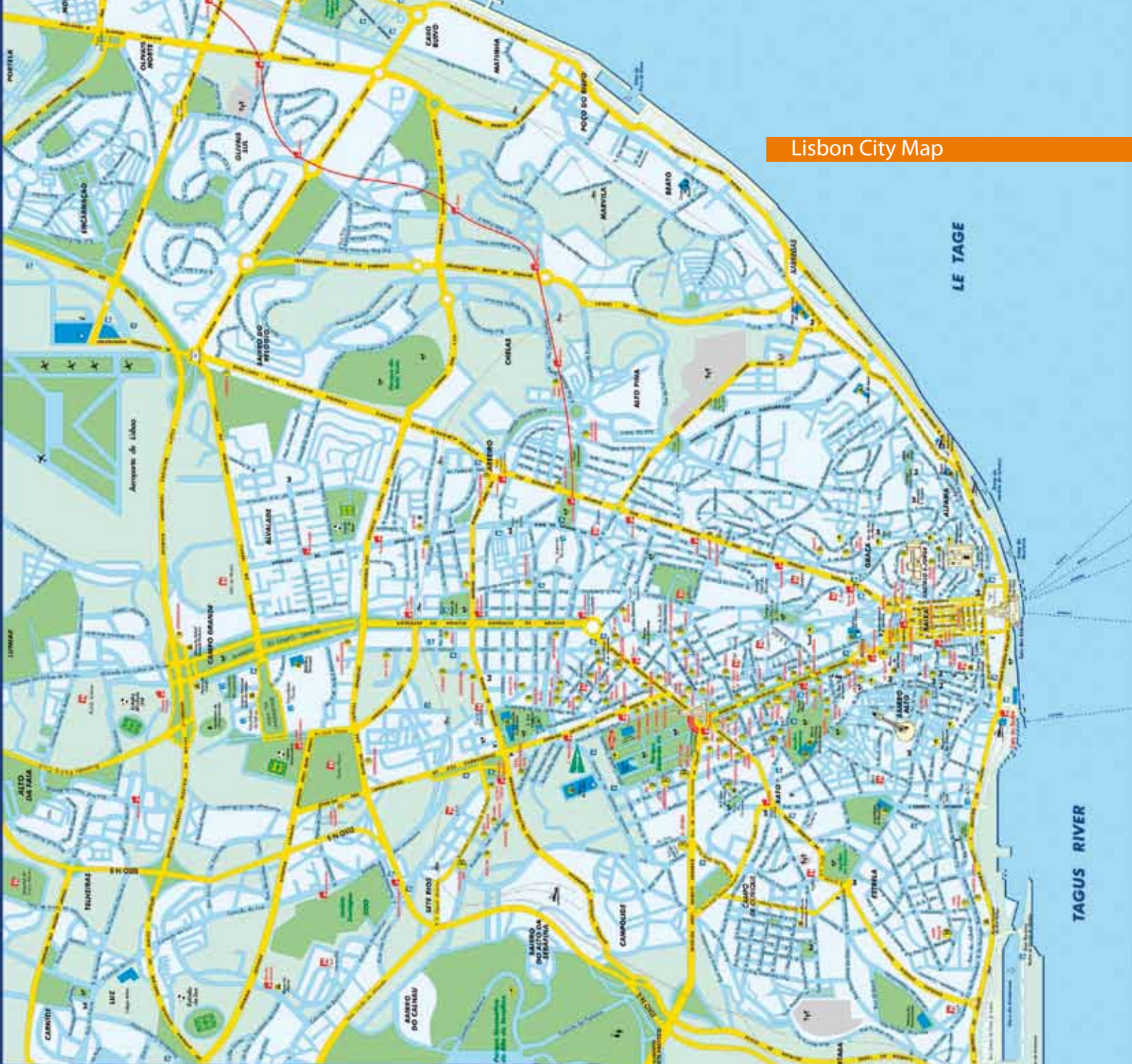
Hotel Check in/out Policy

Smoking

The Portuguese law, in accordance with regulations common to the majority of European countries and the USA, does not allow smoking in any public transportation or in any enclosed public places. (Some restaurants, bars and discos may have a designated smoking area).
